YEAR 7 TRIP - FAITH MUSEUM BISHOP AUCKLAND

N January our Year 7 students excitedly embarked on an enriching trip, delving into the rich tapestry of faith and culture. On the trip pupils explored:

Discovering Faith in Britain:

Students had an interactive tour and trail, of historic churches to mosques, synagogues, and temples, the trip offered a unique opportunity for our Year 7s to witness the evolution of different faiths from ancient times to the present day.






BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK 2024
